This is a required course for individuals seeking licensure in gifted child education in Indiana.

EDPS 54200 is an introduction to curricular materials, curriculum development, and programs for gifted, creative, and talented students. It focuses on the practical development of curriculum and programs for gifted students. Current research and theory is explored through practical curriculum projects, activities, and collaborative evaluation exercises.

Prerequisite: EDPS 54000

Classes are not independent study courses, but interactive sessions with specific deadlines.
